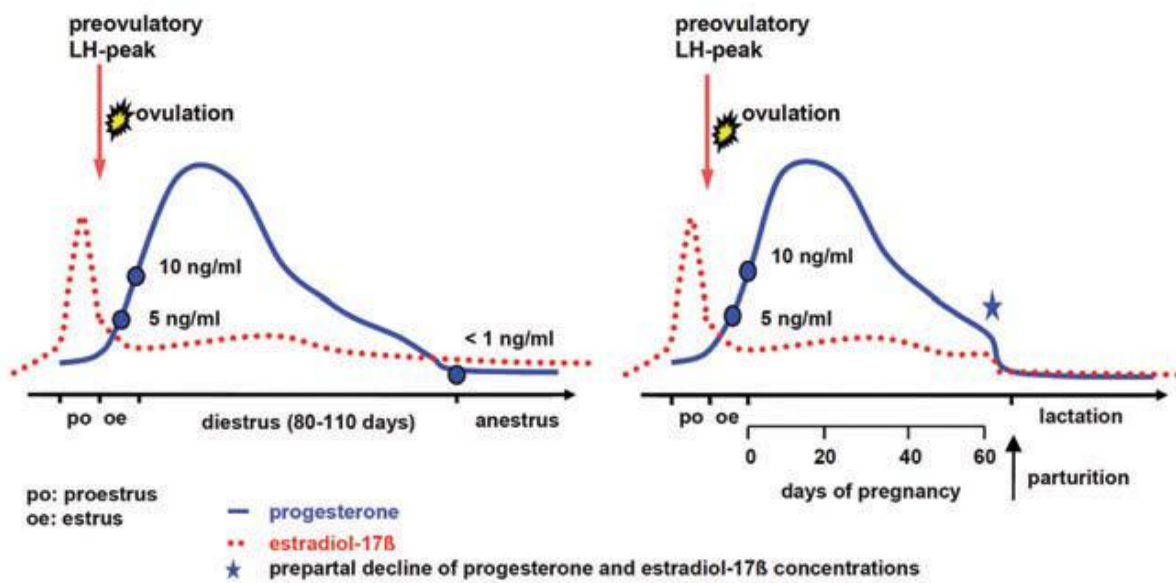


Figure 1. Descriptive and self-explanatory figure legend should be provided.

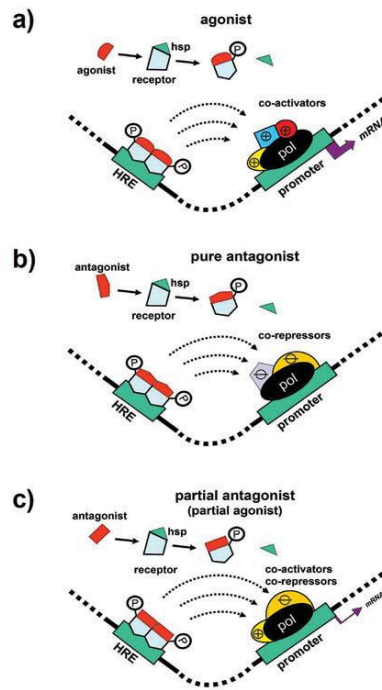


Figure 2. Descriptive figure title explaining the main content of the figure. A. Explanation of panel A; B. Explanation of panel B; C. Explanation of panel C.
